Message from Post 194 Chaplain Dave Bradford:

As I write this, Christmas has just passed, and a New Year is just days ahead. So, I find myself pondering my destiny, not only for the days and years ahead, but also my eternal destiny. Heaven or Hell? As a member of the Honor Guard, lattend several Military Funerals each week. Standing there looking at the flag draped casket, and speaking the words, "You have called this veteran to that land beyond the twilight and the evening star, where beauty, valor, and goodness dwell forever with the unnumbered multitude", I often wonder if that veteran is bound for heaven or for hell. How does God judge who is worthy to pass through the pearly gates and who isn't? I struggle with the answer, or at least a perspective: because of a gift that God granted to Adam and Eve and their progeny. The gift of free-.wll. Some believe, as I do, that because Christ died for our sins, we are forgiven. But relYing on that belief alone seems to imply that nothing is required of us. Heaven is the automatic default. But then I run into that pesky "free-will". If Heaven is the automatic defavlt, that seems to indicate that I don't have a choice. But we all know that God does not renege on a gift or promise. So, if We are forgiven because of Christ's sacrifice, and we also have free will, that indicates that hell is possibly the default. Read John 3: 16-21. Heaven, on the other hand, requires a constant and continual choice on our part. Additionally, because we are a sinful lot, while our sins are forgiven, we still must face the consequences of our sins. Both Moses and Aaron were denied, entrance into the "land of milk and honey" "because you broke faith with me..." (Deuteronomy 32:50-51).

The American poet Robert Frost famously wrote about two paths diverging in the woods. Frost must have been well acquainted with Psalm 1 which talks about the moral path, Heaven (Godly) or Hell (Ungodly» that we must choose. The path to Heaven is difficult and requires constant vigilance and measuring our actions against the Word of God, avery;...pro-active choice. Since we have "free-will", choice if you will, we can choose and know the difference between right and wrong as defined by God's nature and His expressed will in the Word. On the other hand, the path to Hell is wide and easy as it requires nothing of us. It is the default. God did forgive each of us, but like Moses and Aaron, we will endure the consequences of our ungodly actions. The severity of those consequences is known but to God.

Most of us fail to realize that we are exercising our free-will when we choose the Godly path or the ungodly path literally hundreds of times each day. I believe that our reason for being is to worship God, and we worship God by choosing the Godly path. But I suspect that it's way too easy to rollover on Sunday morning instead of going to church. It's way too easy, especially when surrounded by an ungodly world, to eat too much, to drink too much, .to use God's name in vain, to worship false idols (such as money), to lust, to covet. It is too easy~ to just go with the default. In Leviticus chapter 26:14-45 and Revelations 20:13-15, God clearly gefined rewards for obedience and consequences (punishment) for disobedience. So, is the most important question for tomorrow, for the next year, and the remainder of your life, "how willi be judged?". Free Will Choice. Blessings to all!
