Chaplain's Message (From David Bradford, Post 194 Chaplain) -

I have been asked if I am a minister. I am not. I am not a trained Theologian. I'm just an inquisitive person ruminating on something that has piqued my interest, and hopefully something that causes you to consider the issue and read your Bible.

I often wonder why some people believe in God and His Son and attend church regularly while others believe only in the visible world around them. Now to be clear, we all have to live in and deal with the world around us. There is no avoiding that.

But before we dive in, perhaps some definitions and statistics are in order. "Believing" is an acceptance that a statement is true or that something exists. "Faith" is a complete trust or confidence in someone or something.

Statistically, according to PEW Research, 63% truly believe in God, but only 23-25% of adults go to church at least 3 out of 8 Sundays, and only 20% of millennials attend church. Unfortunately, 60% of millennials who grew up in a church do not attend. A Gallup Poll reports that church membership dropped to 47% in 2019; and 21% of Americans do not identify with any religion.

For many believers, their journey began with listening to their parents who imparted and demonstrated faith by practicing good works and living Christ's commandment to "love one another as yourself". Many parents also imparted the practice of prayers at every meal; prayers at bed-time; and church or Sunday School every Sunday and Holyday. "Believing" began because of a total acceptance and faith in what parents said and did. As I attended parochial schools, there was also a religion or catechism class each day. As children grew, they began to question and look more independently at the various lessons and practices. And that's OK. Even one of the Apostles had doubts (read John 20: 27-29). But slowly believers/ church goers moved from a simple acceptance into a more vibrant acceptance where they struggle each day to incorporate those ideas and ideals into their very being, attitudes, and behaviors (read James 1:22-25). But since we are imbued with human frailty, sometimes we are successful and sometimes, well that's when my belief that God is merciful kicks in. So, faithfulness is the key. Keep trying and keep praying. (Read Ephesians 6: 10-18.)

Moses encouraged the Israelites (read Deuteronomy) to hear the statutes and judgements, to learn them and go from memorization to ownership, and to observe them, making them part of their daily life. This is what believers do.

On the other hand, most non-believers/ non-church goers were raised just like you (that is to be honest, hardworking, and generous), except they simply have not had the opportunities to learn of God's love, have not experienced the benefits of regular church attendance, or they were discouraged

by the scandals of child abuse by some members of the clergy, or the scandals that have been committed by some of the most recognizable names in tele-evangelism over the past 4 decades. They can't understand how if God is real that He could allow His representatives to do such bad things. Also, the world with all of its emphasis on material possessions does not do anything to encourage people to believe in God and to come to the church.

True believers tend to react to troubling news with confident faith that God will get them through, rather than a sense of being alone and deep depression. Statistics, unfortunately, point to an increasing number of individuals suffering from Depression and Anxiety.

Romans 5: 2-5 "...we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance (produces) proven character, and proven character (produces) hope, and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

What example do you set for yourself, your family, your grandchildren?
