He served in the following campaigns: Normandy (D-Day), Northern France, the Ardennes (Battle of the Bulge), and central Europe. Recently, Mr. Wiggins celebrated his 102nd Birthday. Chaplain's Message (Dave Bradford)

Do you envy those people who always seem like they don't have a care in the world? How is it that while some don't have a care in the world, and others seem like they are burdened with nothing but problems? I've heard many explanations over the years. Some have labeled it attitude (positive or negative); some label it perspective; and still others call it choice. The famed author Charles Swindoll wrote that "life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it". It seems to me that there is another facet to the issue and that is being aware, being engaged, and being present. By that I mean, the more I am aware of issues (both current and potential), the more I am engaged in thinking about the impact of those issues on my family, my friends, and on me, and the more I make myself present or in the moment, regardless of the impact, I now have the opportunity to choose how I will react. So, are you one of life's spectators; one of life's victims; or one of life's achievers? Is your glass half full or half empty? Or are you one whose glass is half full but the glass has a crack in the bottom and the contents are seeping out? Do you generally possess a positive attitude or a negative attitude? Are you Mary Poppins (not intended to denote a negative) or are you Doom and Gloom?

I'm aware that I am posing a number of questions. And, I'm also aware that there is no right or wrong answer, as we all have the right to make our own choices. Charles Swindoll went on to say that (I'm paraphrasing here) "attitude is more important than facts. It is more important than the past, than education, than money, than circumstances, than failures, than successes, than what other people may think, say or do. It's more important than appearance, giftedness or skill." Roy T. Bennett in his book The Light in the Heart states, "Attitude is a choice. Happiness is a choice. Optimism is a choice. Kindness is a choice. Giving is a choice. Respect is a choice. Whatever choice you make makes you. Choose wisely.".
